VISION





ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

The Bridges Academy is proud to offer a program that not only meets the expectations of the Common Core curriculum but surpasses it. Reference to national standards, including the National Council of Teachers of English (NCTE), National Council of Teachers of Math (NCTM), and Next Generation Standards in Science, as well as the standardized testing offered by the Educational Records Bureau (ERB), affords us the opportunity to consistently monitor, analyze, and refine all aspects of our students' experience. Our teachers receive regular professional development to support this work, including recent workshops offered by Columbia University's Reading and Writing Project.

In our Early Childhood and Lower School programs, the curriculum is focused on hands-on, open-ended activities that develop children's curiosity and problem-solving skills. Instruction is carefully sequenced to encourage skill consolidation and cross-curricular connections.

In the Middle School, dedicated faculty build upon what was learned in the Lower School by providing an in-depth learning experience in language arts, mathematics, science, and social studies.

Courses that round out the student experience include foreign language (Mandarin, French, and Spanish) instruction, STEM, public speaking, art, health, physical education, research, band, strings, and chorus.



INDIVIDUALIZED LEARNING

At The Bridges Academy, we aspire to provide the most academically accelerated program while teaching "The Whole Child" in a complex 21st-century global community. Our lower grades incorporate the "Fundations Reading Program," which uses a multisensory approach to focus on individual learning styles. To complement that, we also use guided reading strategies that allow each student to excel at the level that they are capable of. Our schedule and curricula allow for acceleration in science and mathematics as needed, which ultimately results in different course placements in the upper grades.

The Middle School advisory program sets out to establish strong connections between adults and students so that the student is better understood and embraced, establishing an optimal learning environment.

STEM

The Bridges Academy embraces STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) to prepare our students for the future demands for these skill sets in the workplace. In recent years, significant investment has been made in offering robotics, engineering, 3-D printing, and one-to-one computing throughout the grade levels. These types of project-based activities are integrated into the courses to enhance the student experience.

CHARACTER DEVELOPMENT

One of the pillars of our school is our commitment to character education. Students are active in community outreach programs and understand that service to others is an integral part of their experience at our school. Research indicates that developing moral and ethical character are critical aspects of a child's development and play a central role in how one achieves both in and out of the classroom. To that end, our school has recently entered into a partnership with both the Character Counts Program and Harvard University's Making Caring Common Initiative.

PUBLIC SPEAKING

Public speaking is as much an art as it is a science. Bridges offers many opportunities for our students to speak in front of an audience, starting in our early learning program and continuing through eighth grade. We believe it is critical for our students to be able to communicate their views and thoughts to convince, persuade, and energize others. When we teach students to speak more effectively and understand the basic principles of public speaking, we help them build and grow their leadership skills.



















OUTSIDE THE CLASSROOM

Exploratory classes in technology, art, health and physical education, band, and chorus complement the program and provide a well-rounded education for students. Our students flourish when participating in activities such as our all-school musical, NYSSMA, and the National History and Geography Bees, to name a few. Our students are accepted into the most desired day and boarding secondary schools and ultimately into the finest colleges and universities.

Additionally, our school offers robust extracurricular programming that effectively serves as an extension of the school day. These activities include chess, computer technology, art, drama, soccer, robotics, volleyball, basketball, and yearbook. During the year, The Bridges Academy offers several field trips throughout Long Island and New York City.
